We have received many suggestions for websites offering activities for children and parents to access while schools are closed. Although we are of course delivering learning remotely and this is settling into more of a routine with the new technology we are using, some of the sites listed below might be worth a look when taking a break or where a child's particular interests lie:

CROSS CURRICULAR

 Bitesize offers short daily online lessons for primary and secondary, including daily English and Maths lessons for all year groups. The BBC has a new dedicated TV channel with learning content, offers podcasts on BBC Sounds and educational video on iPlayer. www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize
