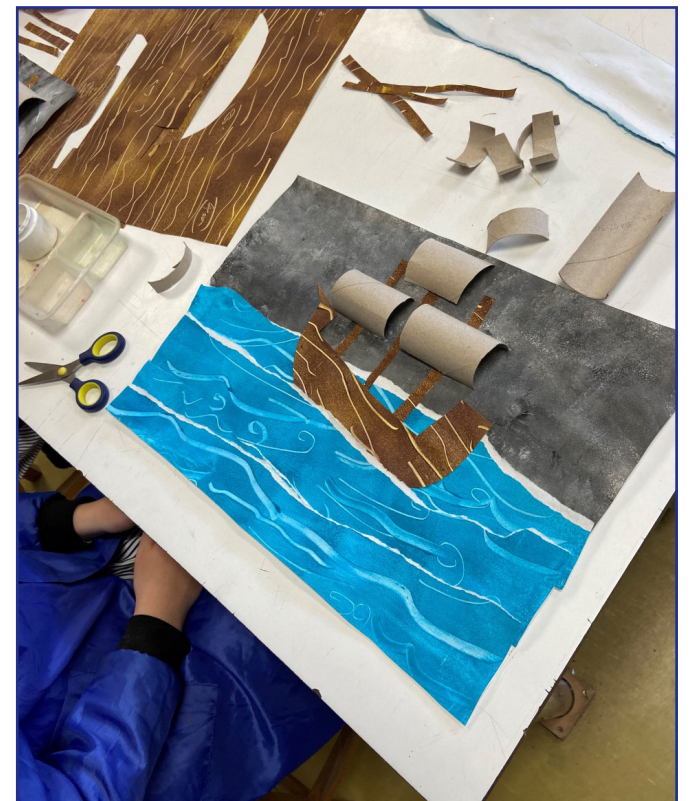
Reception
