### Remembrance

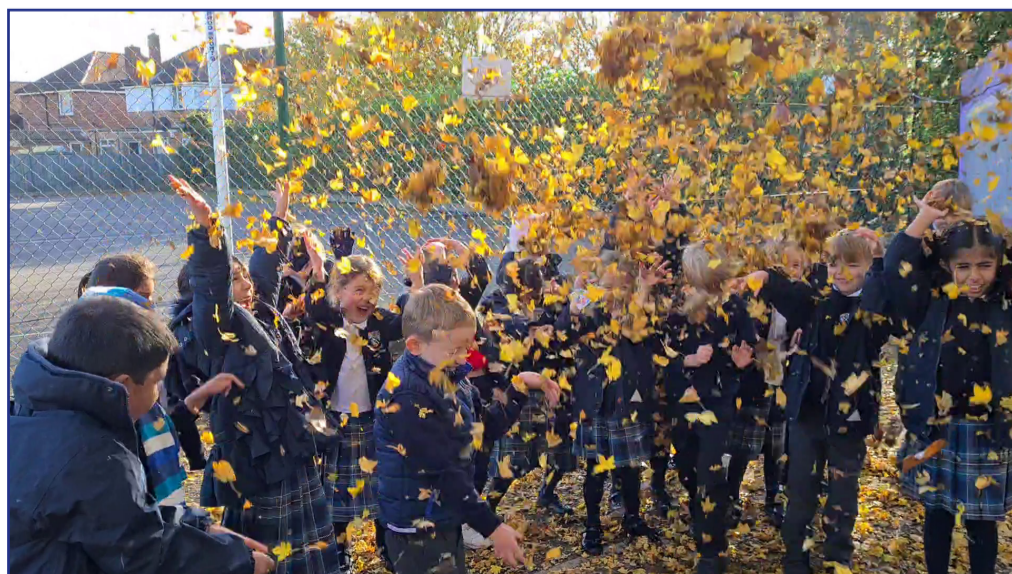

There are many after school clubs and activities for the pupils to try out and the children who have signed up for Fencing Club are showing impressive moves. They are clearly enjoying learning this new skill!

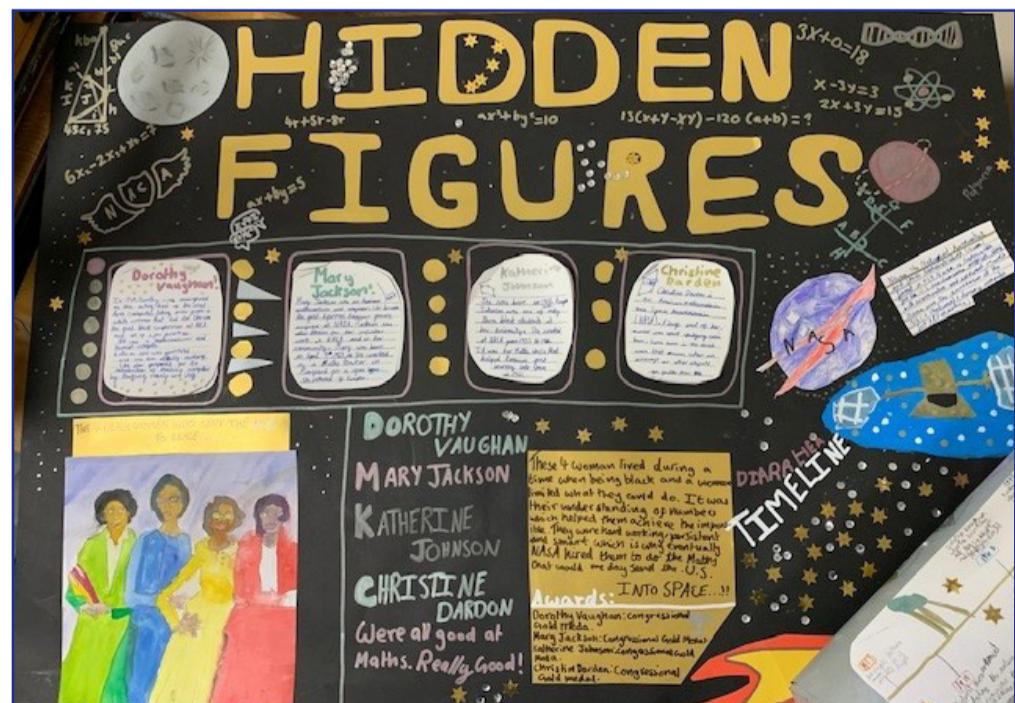


**Black History Month Competition**

- Use the school code 'lpw'
- Select log in with Office 365 option
- Enter your child's log in details. Their email address is usually their first name followed by the first letter of their surname followed by @lancing.org.uk Their password is the number of their year group (unless they are in Years 6-8 and have changed this)

You can then choose to go to the full LPW firefly website to see their current homework tasks and any feedback.
