Senior art club worked from daffodil drawings they completed over the Easter holidays for their dry point etching.

The perspex block was positioned over a selected part of the drawing and then with a sharp needle, hatching lines were scratched into the surface. The heavier the scratching, the darker the ink will be once printed. Once the block is finished a thin layer of ink is worked into the block and any excess removed. The block is then printed onto a damp water colour paper, using a flat bed roller press.





The children had a very enjoyable Friday treat making pizzas at *Pitch*, with former Masterchef winner Kenny Tutt. This was a treat with an educational twist as they created these while using mathematical language involving fractions and ratios, followed by an hour of an hour of bowling, calculating individual and team averages and ranges as they did so!

It was lovely to see Year 8 supporting the performers in our Music Soirée so enthusiastically!




The school is also most grateful to Mr & Mrs Murphy who have so thoughtfully provided us with super fleece blankets for our outdoor events!


