

We are looking forward to seeing the garden coming back to life again this


Year 8 plan their own 'Digging for Britain' project

The pupils are setting out to identify the cause of the very clear parch marks that appear during hot summers on our playing field. With input from Science, History and Maths, they are learning about techniques used by archaeologists, to complete pre-excavation desktop research, identify finds and geophysical surveying. The project will culminate in a week long excavation. They are being supported with a geophysics day led by the survey team of Worthing Archaeological Society who will also provide equipment for the excavation.
