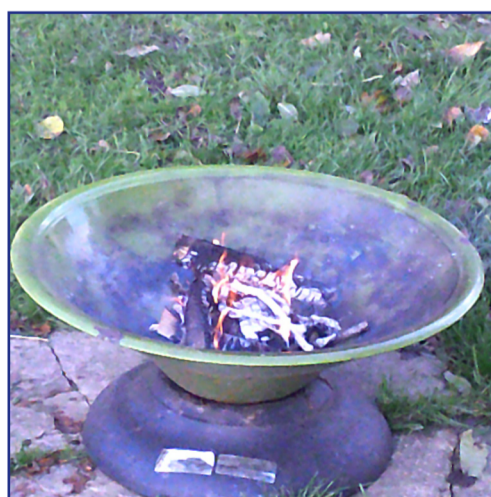

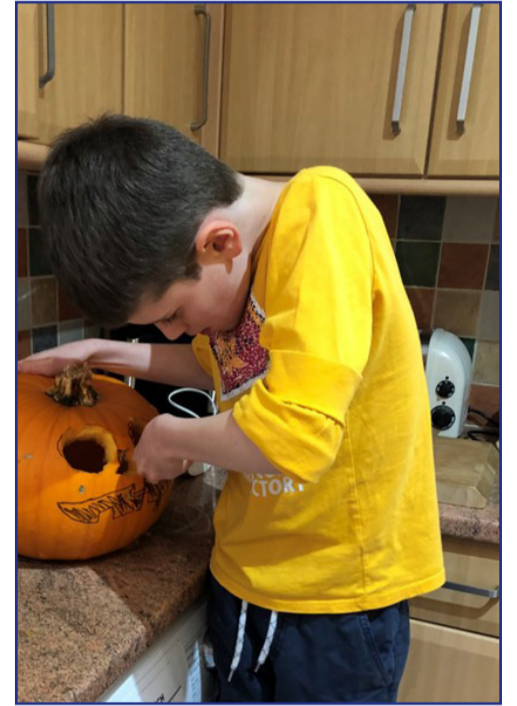
EYFS enjoy building their own bonfire!

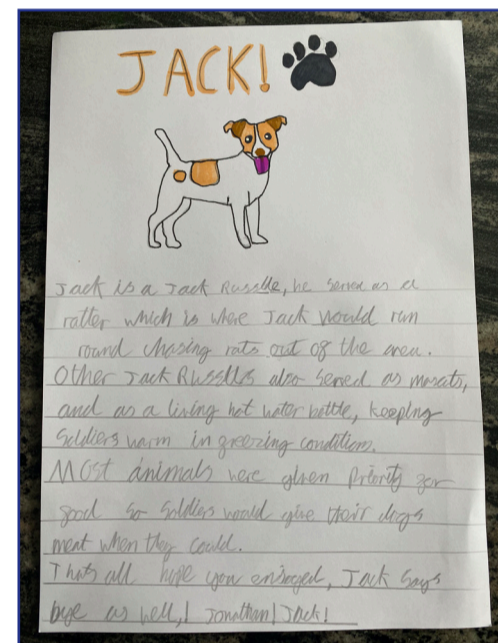
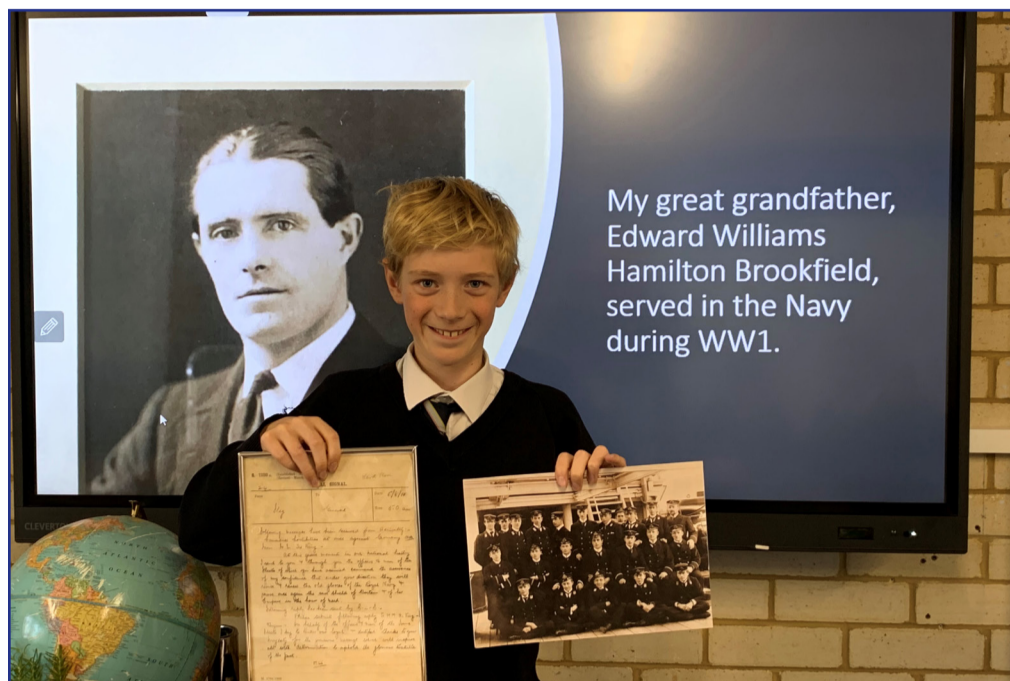

Dear whomever this may concern,

My name is Henny Sonnemann-Petty and I am currently the Youth Mayor of Worthing. Last November I took part in the Lions Young Ambassadors district competition and received funding to run a project in my area. I am writing to you today to let you know of an opportunity I am planning to run for schools and youth groups in Adur and Worthing.

I have always been very passionate about the environment, as are a lot of young people, but as a creative person and an advocate for the benefits of art and creativity for people across generations, I wanted to combine the two for my project. I plan to run a competition across schools and youth groups for young people ages 11-16, to create a piece of artwork out of repurposed materials (either collected from home or around school or if they decide to collect things from the beach etc.. to make sure that it is properly cleaned). The Adur and Worthing Youth Council will then judge this artwork and the winner will not only receive a small prize but their work will hopefully be displayed in a public venue for a short period of time, for the wider community to enjoy. My hope for this project is that it raises awareness of the importance of repurposing and upcycling materials instead of recycling them or throwing them away, bringing light to the idea that new and beautiful things don't need to be made out of new materials.

Young people may work in groups with up to three people, but they may equally work individually. A submission must include their artwork, a list of their repurposed materials, as well as a short paragraph for each question below:

- What does your artwork symbolise?
- Please describe your process/method.
- Why did you create it?

Submissions may be emailed to the following contact: repurposed.project@gmail.com with 3 photos of the submission (front, side and back) and a separate document with the answers to the above questions.

What I felt was also important is that the judging process of this competition was taken seriously, to match the commitment of all submissions entered into the competition. Therefore the project will be judged by the Adur and Worthing Youth Council, a group of 11-18 year olds committed to representing the voices of young people and who are equally involved with how we can best protect our environment.
