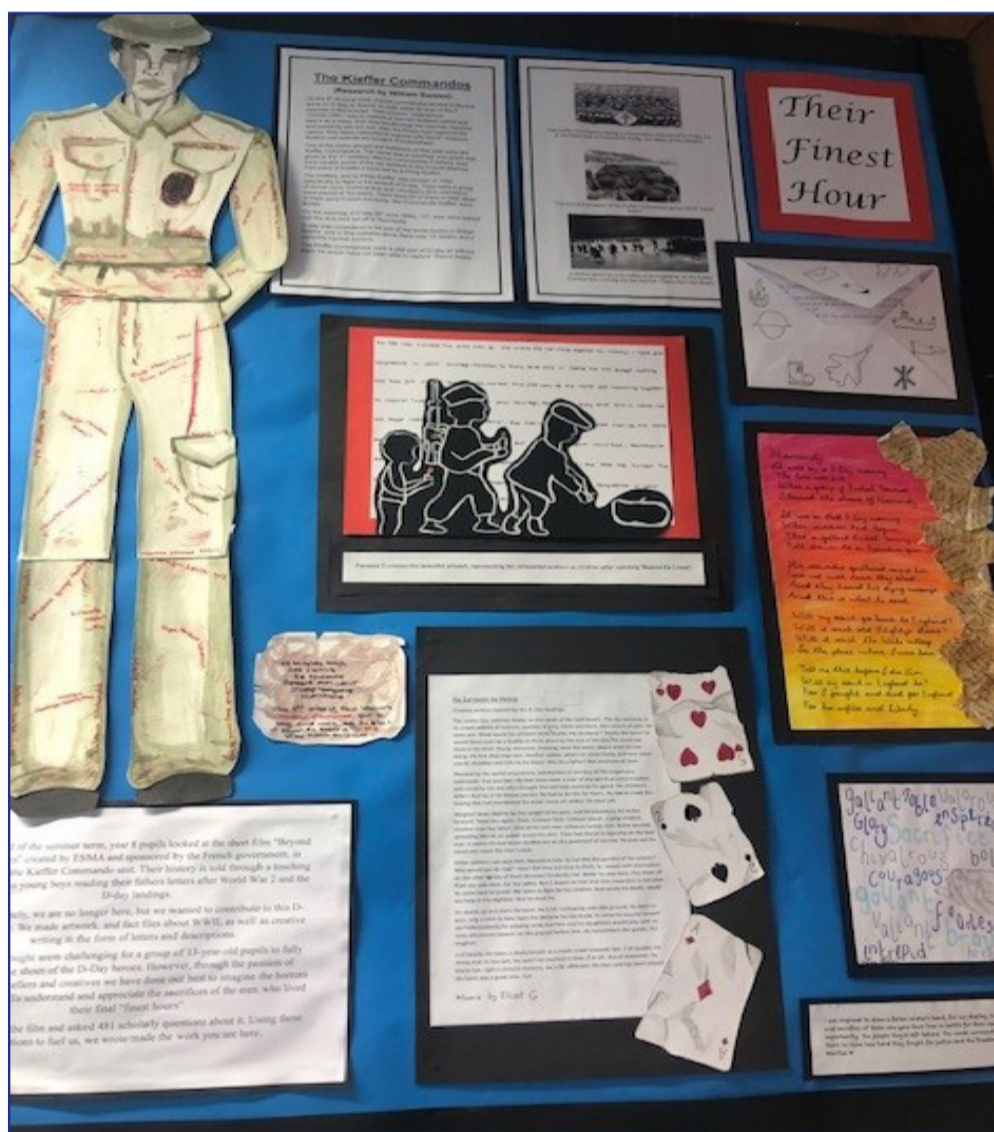
Their Finest Hour English Display
