Our passion for reading for pleasure permeates every year group in the school, every day. However, WBD gave all our children the opportunity to choose a new book to read for pleasure.

The 'Don't Judge a Book by Its Cover' activity involved all pupils doing lots of 'stealth' reading as they read the 'blurb' for lots of books that had been wrapped in newspapers for their year group. Then each pupil chose a book that they wanted to keep. This activity was made possible by the generosity of our parental donations and the remarkable 'wrapping power' of the LPWA. Some pupils also thought about ways of linking modern foreign languages with World Book Day and created some beautiful book marks for their favourite books in another language. We think they are wonderful!

We are pleased to announce the winners from our World Book Month library competition are Maxwell C (Year 4) and Beau H (Year 6).


















































Pre-Prep Storyteller Assembly




Year 5 learn about the Aztecs



Several of our LPW pupils represented Worthing Hockey Club in a Hockey Tournament at Hurstpierpoint College last weekend.




